The Man-Made Leash of Authority

Not for that we have dominion over your faith, but are helpers of your joy: for by faith ye stand
(II Corinthians 1:24).

[Excerpt:] The authority of denominations and sects in the form of tradition frustrates further needed reform and conformity to the Word of God. The authority of man-made institutions is a stubborn thing which resists change ...

We, as the saints of God, find ourselves fenced off institutionally from one another based on various interpretations of men ...

When doctrine is carved in stone as is a confession or doctrinal statement, we merely promote another man-made tradition, no matter how close it is to the truth; because if it is possible to get closer to the truth, we find out that we are tethered to someone else's understanding by a leash of authority and can proceed no closer. If we dare to break the tether, we threaten all our relationships that are still tied to it and face the trauma of breaking the communion of saints built over a lifetime. Thus, one might more readily be inclined as well to stick with mind-numb-

ing tradition rather than suffer the consequences. ...

We ought not to set up false and invalid authority structures to force conformity to some uniform human religious standard. We can't force what we believe on someone else. They must accept it and own it for themselves.

Why Did God Give the Law?



Love Doesn't Seek its Own

[Excerpt:] Love does not inquire into the character of the recipient, but it asks what he needs. It does not love him because he is such-and-such a person but because he is there. In all this it is quite the opposite of natural love: it “*does not seek its own*” (I Corinthians 13:5).

It does not perform the characteristic natural impulse of love and life. Therefore, it is independent of the conduct of the other person; it is not conditional but absolute. It wants nothing for itself but only for others.

Therefore, it is also not vulnerable. It never reacts but is always spontaneous, emerging by its own strength – rather, from the power of God. Love is the real God-likeness of man for which he has been created. In so far as love is in man, he really resembles God



Considered a classic in Christian apologetics, this scholarly analysis of the biblical phrase "without form and void," from the opening chapter of Genesis, observes the rules of linguistics, grammar and syntax, and also examines how words are used in the rest of Scripture. This book has been described as the best argument that has ever been written for the Gap Theory.

A well respected Canadian scientist, and listed in the 1971 American Men in Science, Dr. Custance contends that we should not allow science to determine what Scripture says. Neither should we allow Scripture to determine what the scientist observes in the laboratory. Yet observed fact in the one cannot, ultimately, conflict with revealed fact in the other. Any conflict, then, is in the interpretation of the facts – not in the facts themselves.

The Absolute Sovereignty of God: A truth that brings comfort and peace as we grasp the reality that God is in control of *all* things.



As I consider the impact this Study Bible could have, I am reminded of the legacy left by E.W. Bullinger, a pioneer in the production of study Bibles. Over a century ago Bullinger faced a similar challenge. He had accumulated a lifetime of knowledge and insight into the Scriptures, but realized that there was no effective way to compile and distribute this information to future generations.

At the age of 70, Bullinger began work on his *Companion Bible*, which has had an enormous influence on those seeking to understand the deeper truths of God's Word. With the help of faithful co-laborers like Sir Robert Anderson, Bullinger was able to compile his notes, insights and teachings into what has become a treasured resource for believers worldwide.

The *Companion Bible* has reached people for over a hundred years – many of whom found its teachings transformative. I often meet people who tell me that Bullinger's work was their introduction to the truths we hold dear. His Bible allowed him to leave behind more than his books or periodicals ever could have. I



believe we have a similar opportunity today.

The Challenge of Time and Resources

I am passionate about this project, but there's also a hard reality I face: time. The day-to-day work of ministry is both fulfilling and overwhelming. Gathering and producing material for the *Bible Student's Notebook* and *Daily Email Goodies*, managing book orders, answering phone calls and emails – all of this fills my days to the brim.

While I am incredibly grateful for the growth and reach of this ministry, the time needed to dedicate myself fully to the Study Bible Project simply does not exist in my current schedule.

This is why I am reaching out to you for help. In order to move forward with this Study Bible, I need to bring on a full-time assistant – someone who can labor beside me, managing the daily tasks of the ministry, freeing me to focus on this monumental project.

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
