KNOWING HIM

If you want to get to know who you are, who are you going to have to get to know? *Christ!* In other words, to discover *your* true identity, you will have to discover Him Who alone is your life.



It is impossible to know who you really are apart from Christ – apart from knowing Him. Realizing this one simple truth frees you from the "know thyself" worldview. You are delivered from it by knowing the Lord Jesus Christ, in Whom you have your new, *true* identity.

Hear Paul again,

*That I may **know Him**, and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being made conformable unto His death* (Philippians 3:10).

The call of the believer's life is not some human, self-centered psychology of "know thyself," but by the divine, Christ-centered spirituality of "*know **Him***."

E.W. Bullinger (1837-1913) wrote,

The ancient philosophy had a motto continually sounding in its ears, "Know thyself." This saying was introduced by Solon, one of the seven wise

men of Greece, and the wisest of them all. A lawgiver, a great reformer, and a great patriot, 638 years before Christ, Solon gave this as his most precious wisdom. It was carved over all the schools and seats of learning, its letters may be seen today carved in the marble ruins of Greece. It was good, so far as man's wisdom went; it was the best that man could do!

[But], we can only know ourselves by the knowledge of Christ. [Paul] came and brought a loftier motto, a heavenly wisdom, a Divine truth: "*That I may know Him*."¹

Paul also wrote,

Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glo-

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ry to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord (II Corinthians 3:17-18).

BEHOLDING AND BECOMING

Paul tells us that as we behold the glory of the Lord, we are changed into His Image. This is the principle of what we might call *Beholding and Becoming*. As you behold *Him*, you are transformed into *His* Image. This *beholding and becoming* is carried out and accomplished in the very details of your life. The Father is steadily at work in you, manifesting the life of His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. Thus, He accomplishes this in the most difficult circumstances that life may throw at you. This is the great plan of God in your life.

Changed

The Father is transforming you, so that you are being “**changed** into the same Image.” This word “**changed**” is the Greek word *metamorphoō*² from which we get our word “metamorphose,” which Webster defines as,

to change into a different form; to transform.³

It appears three other times in the Greek Scriptures. It is used twice of the Lord Jesus Christ's transfiguration:

And after six days Jesus takes with Him Peter,

*and James, and John, and leads them up into an high mountain apart by themselves: and He was **transfigured** [metamorphoō] before them* (Mark 9:2).

*And was **transfigured** [metamorphoō] before them: and His face did shine as the sun, and His raiment was white as the light* (Matthew 17:2).

This same word is used again by Paul in Romans chapter 12:

*And be not conformed to this world: but **be transformed** [metamorphoō] by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God* (Romans 12:2).

Image

Just exactly what is this “**change**”? We are being transformed “**into the same Image**” of the Son. The Greek word for “**image**” is *eikōn*.⁴ Its usage by Paul the Apostle is very telling. He uses this word in reference to the Lord Jesus Christ being in the “**Image of God**”:

*... Christ, Who is **the Image** [eikōn] of God ...* (II Corinthians 4:4).

*... Who is **the Image** [eikōn] of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature* (Colossians 1:15).

Sonship: A Comprehensive Compilation

The Romans 9 “*sonship*” is the exclusive prerogative of “*Israel according to the flesh*,” the Galatians 4 “*sonship*” extends to the spiritual seed of Abraham who are not “*after the flesh*” (:23), but was associated with “*Jerusalem which is above*” (:26). However, the Ephesians “*sonship*” has no relationship whatsoever to Abraham or Israel. It has no connection with the promises made unto the fathers, it is not founded on an earthly inheritance (allotment). The Ephesians “*sonship*” extends back before the disruption of the world, and extends “*far above*” all heavens. These three “*sonship*” distinctions correspond to the three distinct spheres of blessing. This book contains 14 works from 10 authors, spanning 100 years.

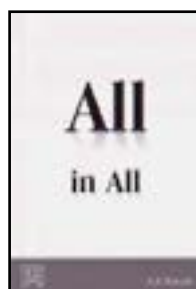
Everything God does, every plan of His, every longing in His heart is rooted in His love. It always has been and always will be.

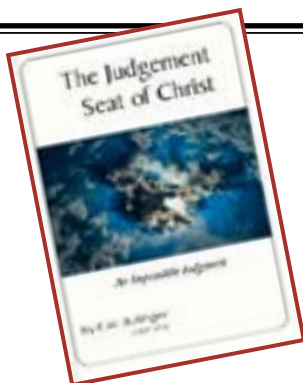
Aspects of God that are generally undervalued are His depth of love, His wisdom, intellect, knowledge and sovereign authority. What the world does not realize is that knowing God is one of the most precious possessions one can have.

Although we cannot do anything on our own to grow spiritually, Scripture tells us that by fixing our eyes on the glorified Christ (not the traditional picture

Heavens are higher than the Earth, so are My ways higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:8-9, NKJV).

"... but let him who glories glory in this, that he understands, and knows Me, that I am the LORD exercising lovingkindness, judgment, and righteousness in the Earth. for in these I delight," says the LORD (Jeremiah 9:24, NKJV).

Getting to know God does not come automatically and no one can attain to that knowledge by his or her own effort.

The one who really knows the Father is Jesus, His Son. It is the Son Who reveals the Father, and He does so according to His will and desire, which will be in line with the Father's will and desire. Without that revelation, a person cannot get to know God. That is why Jesus said.

All was given up to Me by My Father. And no one is recognizing the Son except the Father; neither is anyone recognizing the Father except the Son and he to whom the Son should be intending to unveil Him (Matthew 11:27, CV).

As we grow in our knowledge of Him, our appreciation and love for Him will increase accordingly.

For the Apostle Paul, no knowledge was more important than knowing Christ.

But to be sure, I am also deeming all to be a forfeit because of the superiority of the knowledge of Christ Jesus, my Lord, because of Whom I forfeited all, and am deeming it to be refuse, that I

should be gaining Christ ... (Philippians 3:8, CV).

Paul's earnest prayer for the Church in Ephesus was

... that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may be giving you a spirit of wisdom and revelation in the realization of Him ... (Ephesians 1:17, CV).

For us, who are part of the One Church which is His Body, it is God Himself Who opens our hearts and eyes to receive wisdom and revelation regarding knowledge of Him. It is something we cannot generate by ourselves.

In eons to come, that revelation of Who, what and how God is, will be granted to more and more people. For Israel, there is a prophecy that there will be a time when all of them will know God.

"Behold, the days are coming," says the LORD, "when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and with the House of Judah – not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day that I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt, My covenant which they broke, though I was a husband to them," says the LORD.

"But this is the covenant that I will make with the House of Israel after those days," says the LORD: "I will put My Law in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people. No more shall every man teach his neighbor, and every man his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they all shall know Me, from the least of them to the

greatest of them,” says the LORD. “For I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin I will remember no more” (Jeremiah 31:31-34, NKJV).

Part of the New Covenant with Israel will be that God will remove the scales from their eyes so that they will get to know God for Who He really is. This will apply to all Israel across the board, from the least to the greatest. No one will have to explain God to another, for they will all know Him. This illustrates the fact that God is the One Who calls the shots, the One Who decides when and to whom He will reveal Himself.

This knowledge of God will in time spread over all the Earth.

For the Earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the glory of Jehovah, as the waters cover the sea (Hab 2:14, ASV).

This is what “*eonian life*” is all about. It is about getting to know the only true God and His Son, Jesus Christ. It will be the main focus. The focus of this life, whether it be the pursuit of money or wealth or possessions, or the struggle to make a living or to excel in any human endeavor, will in future eons become irrelevant.

Now it is eonian life that they may know Thee, the only true God, and Him Whom Thou dost commission, Jesus Christ (John 17:3, CV).

Even celestial beings are now, and will be in future eons, learning about the great wisdom of God. Interestingly enough, it is the Ecclesia (the One Church which is His Body) that plays a part in this.

... that now may be made known to the sovereignties and the authorities among the celestials, through the ecclesia, the multifarious wisdom of God, in accord with the purpose of the eons, which He makes in Christ Jesus, our Lord; (Ephesians 3:10-11, CV).

There will always be room for growth in the knowledge of God and Christ. As one gains in this knowledge, the depth of one’s appreciation of Him will be like an ever-rising graph. The desire to give Him glory will never fade. It will rather grow stronger as

time passes by.

Yet be growing in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be glory now, as well for the day of the eon. Amen! (II Peter 3:18, CV). BSN
