Christianity Is a Delusion

Christopher Hitchens famously said, “Religion is humanity’s oldest delusion.” A delusion is defined as a false belief that persists even when evidence proves otherwise. Religion, in all its forms – Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism, modern Judaism, and yes, Christianity – is built on such delusions. But Christianity is the most harmful because it uses the name of Christ to lend itself credibility. It claims to be “the truth,” yet it binds people with fear, guilt and manipulation.



offering nothing in return but fear and guilt.

TWISTING SCRIPTURE AND DISCOURAGING QUESTIONS

Christianity twists Scripture to fit its agenda. Take Hebrews 10:24-25: “*Do not forsake the assembling of yourselves together.*” This verse is often used to guilt people into attending church, yet there’s no clear guidance on where, how often, or with whom these gatherings must happen.

THE FALSE PROMISES OF CHRISTIANITY

Christianity offers salvation from hell, meaning in life, community, safety in rules and numbers, security through accountability, and certainty about life’s big questions. It promises that you’ll belong to an in-group with a powerful leader, taking the hard work of thinking for yourself off of your shoulders.

But here’s the catch: you get these promises only if you do what they say. Otherwise, you’re told that you’ll face eternal torment in hell.

Christianity pulls you into its system of rituals, claiming that they make you holy and protect you from sin. Baptism, communion, tithing – these are presented as visible proof that you’re part of the right group and have God’s approval. Yet no matter how many rules or rituals they add, their central demand remains the same: “Accept Jesus, or burn in hell.”

The irony? God has already done everything for us. Religion blinds people to this truth, keeping them trapped in systems that thrive on rules and rituals,

Christianity also discourages honest questions. When people ask hard questions, they’re often told, “It’s a mystery” or, “*God’s ways are not our ways*” (Isaiah 55:8-9). Instead of encouraging deeper understanding, these answers shut down discussion, leaving people to wrestle with doubt and confusion on their own. Truth doesn’t need to fear scrutiny – if something is true, it will stand up to questioning.

FEAR, GUILT, AND THE BAIT-AND-SWITCH

Christianity doesn’t just discourage critical thinking; it actively controls people with fear and guilt. The system guilts you into tithing, even though the practice isn’t biblical today. Most of the money doesn’t help those in need – it goes to buildings and salaries,

feeding the system instead of the people.

The message starts as good news: "You're free in Christ!" – but the moment you're inside, it becomes a never-ending list of expectations. Instead of peace, it gives you fear – fear of hell, fear that your family and friends are doomed, fear that one wrong move will send you over the edge.

What's good about *that* news?

The truth is, Christianity has turned the gospel into a conditional offer: "This is good news, but *only if* you accept it." That's not an announcement of grace – it's a transaction. The real good news is that God's grace benefits everyone, whether they realize it or not.

THE REALITY OF BONDAGE

Religion isn't freedom – it's bondage. It uses fear of hell, rejection and disapproval to keep people in line. It manipulates its adherents with tradition, bad translations and flawed interpretation, promising community but abandoning people the moment they fail to meet expectations.

If you're trapped in this system, let me say this: *Run. Don't walk.*

A KINDNESS TOWARD THE BLIND

I don't hate the people caught in the religious system – I hate the system itself. Many sincere people are trapped, blinded by teachings designed to keep them in line. In reality, it's not their fault. God has blinded

their eyes for now, shielding them from the truth for His purposes (*cf.* II Corinthians 4:4). Eventually, they will see and understand – most of them at the resurrection. At that time, they'll experience what my friend Mike Owens calls *Post-Resurrection Amazement*, when the veil is lifted, and they finally comprehend the fullness of God's love and grace. So, how do we treat the blind? With kindness. We guide them away from danger and toward safety, not with anger but with understanding.

JESUS ISN'T PART OF CHRISTIANITY

One of the biggest reasons that people reject Jesus is because they think that He's part of the Christian religion. But Jesus isn't part of any religion – He stands outside of them all.

Many people fear that leaving Christianity will lead to moral collapse – as if missing one church service on Sunday means that suddenly I'm a criminal mastermind by Monday – but that fear is another tool of the system. Leaving religion doesn't lead to chaos – it leads to freedom.

LIVING IN TRUE FREEDOM AND PEACE

Freedom and peace are never found within the walls of religion. These systems thrive on control, fear and guilt. True freedom doesn't come from keeping rules or meeting expectations; rather, it comes from trusting God to guide you.

When God reveals Himself to you, everything changes. You no longer need rituals or rules to feel secure.

Romans 8:9

... He is None of His ... (KJV).

*But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, **he is none of His** (Romans 8:9, KJV).*

*Yet you are not in flesh, but in spirit, if so be that God's spirit is making its home in you. Now if anyone has not Christ's spirit, **this one is not His** (CV).*

Q: If all belong to God, and all will be saved, how is it that Paul states that there are some that are “none of His”?

A: Let's break down the verse by the two important distinctions in the verse: “God's spirit” and “Christ's spirit.”

*Yet you are not in flesh, but in spirit, if so be that **God's spirit** is making its home in you. Now if anyone has not **Christ's spirit**, **this one is not His** (Romans 8:9, CV).*

“GOD'S SPIRIT”

Concerning “God's spirit,” the Greek word translated “dwell(s)” in most English versions is οἰκέω (*oikeō*). Strong's (G3611) defines it, “to occupy a house that is, reside.”

Oikeō is more than mere presence, as Strong's definition goes on to state, it means “to cohabit,” or, as A.T. Robertson (1863-1934), in his classic Greek work, *Word Pictures in the New Testament*, explains, *oikeō* is the “present active imperative of *enoikeō*, to make one's home, to be at home.”



God's Revealed Purpose

H.W. Fry was an associate of E.W. Bullinger and A.E. Knoch and contributor to *Things to Come* and *Unsearchable Riches* magazine. His many works included *God's Plan in the Bible*. He was a grandson of Elizabeth Fry, the Quaker prison reformer. He was also an intimate friend of the Salvation Army's founders, William and Catherine Booth. It is said that it was largely owing to Fry's influence that the Salvation Army would not observe baptism

and the Lord's Supper. This book shows that in introducing sin and evil into the universe, God was giving the greatest proof of His wisdom, love and goodness. Chapters include: (1) God's Revealed Purpose; (2) The Three Spheres; (3) Pentecost; (4) Biographical Sketch. See [order form](#) under “Other Authors.”



Thus, the *Concordant Literal Translation* rightfully renders it “making its home in you.”

Yet you are not in flesh, but in spirit, if so be that God’s spirit is making its home in you.

So, while we can gain some sense of *oikeō* from the English translation of “dwell(s),” a more literal rendering better reveals the true force of the word.

In the most expansive reality, God is in fact *omni-present* – He is everywhere-present. God’s all-encompassing presence fills His ENTIRE creation, and this would certainly include within ALL beings.

Further, it may be said that in the *absolute* sense, it is God’s *breath* (His *spirit [pneuma]*) that is in ALL living beings. So much so that, when God “breathed into his nostrils **the breath of life**; man became a living soul.” Thus Job 34:14-15 plainly declares:

If [God] places it in His heart concerning [humanity], He can gather back His spirit and His breath to Himself; [and] all flesh would expire together, and humanity would return to the soil.

Therefore, when man *expires*, breathing his last breath,

... the spirit, it returns to the One, Elohim, Who gave it (Ecclesiastes 12:7, CV).

Thus, Paul boldly declares, even to the Athenian pagans on Mars’ Hill,

For in Him we are living and moving and are (Acts 17:28, CV).

Yet *relatively*, it is said **only** of believers that “God’s spirit is making its **home** in you.”

So, while God is certainly **in all**,

*one God and Father of all, Who is over all and through all and **IN ALL** (Ephesians 4:6, CV),*

nonetheless, God is not currently **at home** in all.

However, when “God’s spirit is making its **home** in you,” one is elevated beyond the Adamic realm of “in flesh” to the Divine realm of “in spirit.”

Thus, this verse speaks of *standing*, which is no longer “in flesh, but in spirit.” We have no confidence in our former standing. We no longer have any “confidence in flesh” (Philippians 3:3, CV).

“CHRIST’S SPIRIT”

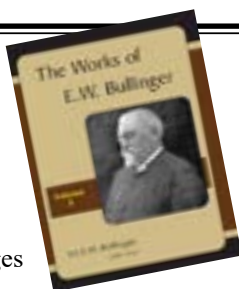
Verse and chapter divisions (which were not a part of the original Scriptures) often cause passages to be isolated from their context, resulting in lost meaning and confusion.

The portion of Scriptures contained in Romans chapter 8 is concerning *spirit* life – of a standing different than *flesh*.

Paul uses the word “spirit” (πνεῦμα, *pneuma*) 35

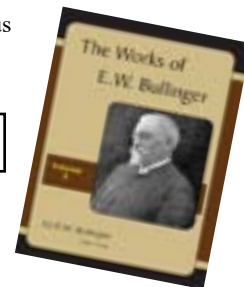

times in his letter of Romans, however, well over half of all of these occurrences (22) are found in chapter 8.

When *God's spirit is at home* in you, we come into possession of "*Christ's spirit*," and likewise we become uniquely Christ's possession. Christ and the believer have a reciprocal possession of each other. He belongs to us, and we to Him. This is not now true of all humanity. One day this mutual possession will be a reality for all, when Christ's work of reconciliation has been completed. Then all will be Christ's, and He will belong to all, and then God in turn will be "*All in all*" (I Corinthians 15:28; Ephesians 1:23).

For now, all *belong* to God – as His "*offspring*" (Acts 17:28-29) – and He is "*in all*" (Ephesians 4:6). Yet, the majority of humanity remain *alienated* from Him in their *minds* (Colossians 1:21), and thus, "*God's spirit*" is not "*making its home*" in them. They know nothing of *spirit* life – they know only *flesh* life. As a result, they do not yet *belong* to Christ, they are "*not His*," (Romans 8:9, CV), because they do not presently possess Christ's *spirit* – "*the spirit of life in Christ Jesus*" – which makes them "*free from the principle of sin and death*" (:2, ULB).

However, in the Consummation all will belong to Christ and will be gloriously set free. We are a foretaste of what all humanity will be, for, "*we ourselves also ... have the **FIRSTFRUIT** of the spirit*" (:23).

We who have been granted faith are free from fear

and can embrace God as Father! For, "*Christ's spirit*" is "*the spirit of sonship*," whereby "*we are crying, Abba, Father!*" having been freed from "*slavery's spirit to fear*" (:15).

Thus, surveying our *spirit standing*, we learn that "*nothing, consequently, is now condemnation*" (:1), and that we are "*in accord with spirit*" (:5), and that "*the disposition of the spirit is life and peace*" (:6).

All of the rest of creation are "*awaiting the unveiling of the sons of God*" (:19). They have this as a "premonition" (:19) that they "*ALSO, shall be freed from the slavery of corruption into the glorious freedom of the children of God*" (:21). In the meantime, "*the entire creation is groaning and travailing together until now ... awaiting the sonship, the deliverance of our body.*" (:22-23).

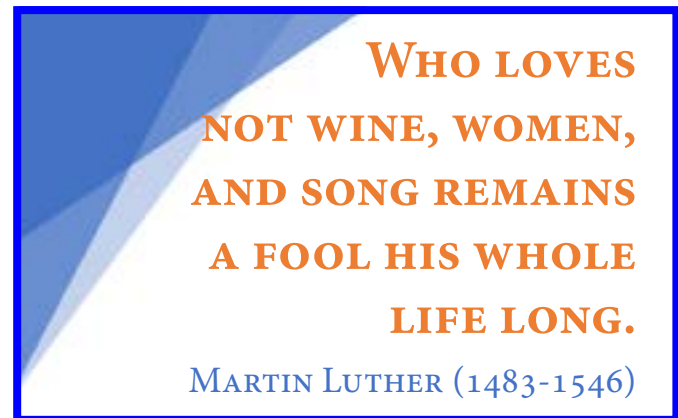
and it never fails to educate, inspire and inform. I want to thank you for that. – **MI**
