What then, shall we declare to these things?

Surely, He Who spares not His own Son, but gives Him up for us all, how shall He not, together with Him, also, be graciously granting us all?

God, the Justifier?

Who is the Condemner?

Christ Jesus, the One dying, yet rather being roused, Who is also at God's right hand, Who is pleading also for our sakes?

What shall be separating us from the love of God in Christ Jesus?

Affliction, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?
— (Romans 8:31-35, CV).

Do you ever wonder why many of the teachers in the Bible asked questions, but didn't necessarily answer the questions?¹

When we tell someone something, they really don't have to think very hard about what we are telling them, because we are giving them information which may not require a response.



However, if we ask them a question about the subject matter, they have to think about it and answer it for themselves. Once they answer the question in their own mind, they usually settle on an answer and are at peace with their answer until new data is introduced or presented to them.

As we read through Scripture, we should continually ask ourselves questions. Especially about why

1. [Editor:] Paul, the apostle, is a great example, as seen in the 9 questions that he posed in the short span of the 5 verses listed above (Romans 8:31-35).

In fact, Paul asks his readers 60 questions throughout the book of Romans alone.

Concerning the example of Jesus Christ, one author calls Him the "Great Questioner," stating, "To be precise, Jesus asks 307 questions. He is asked 183 of which he only answers 3. Asking questions was central to Jesus' life and teachings. In fact, for every question he answers directly he asks — literally — a hundred." (*Jesus is the Question*, Martin B. Copenhaver).

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we are settled on a particular answer or view to a question we have asked. Learning and growth is less about the answers we receive from others and more about the questions we ask ourselves. A well-placed question about a particular aspect of Scripture can help us pause to meditate on the Word. The pause and meditation we take allow us to settle into a place about the question. This place we settle into is called our “current understanding.”

If a question doesn’t exist, what are the chances of us searching the matter out like a Berean (Acts 17:11)? **The questions we have about Scripture are blessings which keep our minds on those “things above.”** You will never run out of questions about the written Word. Questions about God’s Word equal keeping our minds on “things above.”

Set your affection on things above, not on things on the Earth (Colossians 3:2, KJV).

Be disposed to that which is above, not to that on the Earth (CV).

Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on Earth (ESV).

If we had the answers, we would never have the need to open our Bibles. We mistakenly sometimes think that our belief is truth, when, in fact, our belief is just the place where God has brought us to an “understanding” – all for His purpose, of course.

And if any man think that he knoweth any thing, he knoweth nothing yet as he ought to

know (I Corinthians 8:2, KJV).

If anyone is presuming to know anything, he knew not as yet according as he must know (CV).

Ask, ask and ask! Question everything!

Some might say the following verses refer to asking and receiving earthly physical things, such as good health, etc.; but nowhere is it implied – or, is it? What do you think? How’s that million dollars coming that you keep asking Him about?

Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened (Matthew 7:7-8, KJV).

Request and it shall be given you. Seek and you shall find. Knock and it shall be opened to you. For everyone who is requesting is obtaining, and who is seeking is finding, and to him who is knocking it shall be opened (CV).

Is it talking about asking and seeking an understanding of Scripture, or physical things you might want or need?

To whom was this passage directed?

Was this question asked during our current administration of the grace of God?

Will we get anything we request?

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The Divine Cycle ~ Introduction

For out of Him, and through Him, and to Him is all ... (Romans 11:36, BSV).

Here is the simple, glorious truth of Romans 11:36 in a nutshell:

- (1) All is *out* of God.
- (2) All is *through* God.
- (3) All is *to* God.

The knowledge that “all” comes “out” of God, that “all” operates “through” God, and that “all” is returning “to” God settles the weary heart and brings peace to the troubled mind.



Romans 11:36 is the *Divine Cycle* and is a bedrock truth often repeated by Paul our Apostle:

One God, the Father, out of Whom all is (I Corinthians 8:6, CV).

All is of God (I Corinthians 11:12; II Corinthians 5:18, CV).

The One Who is operating all in accord with the counsel of His will (Ephesians 1:11, CV).

A.E. Knoch (1874-1965) skillfully summarized the core truths of Romans 11:36.

This is the most comprehensive statement which can be uttered. The universe sprang out of Him, and it has its course in Him, and He will be its ultimate. This settles all speculation as to the origin of all things. Creation is out of God, not out of nothing. This explains universal history. God is the One



back of all the movements of mankind. This reveals the goal of all things. God is so guiding all His creatures that, eventually, He will become their All.¹

THREE PREPOSITIONS OF SOVEREIGNTY

In Romans 11:36 Paul reveals to us the three prepositions of God's absolute sovereignty:

ἐκ — διά — εἰς
out — *through* — *to*

ἐκ (ek) — “out of” – is defined as:

A primary preposition denoting *origin* (the point whence motion or action proceeds), *from, out* (SEC).

διά (dia) — “through” – is defined as:

A primary preposition denoting the *channel* of an act; *through* (SEC).

εἰς (eis) — “to” – is defined as:

A primary preposition; *to* or *into* (indicating the point reached or entered), *of place, time or purpose* (SEC).

Thus, that “all” is “out of God” speaks of ORIGIN; that “all” is “through God” speaks of the CHANNEL; and that “all” is “to God” speaks of CONSUMMATION.

and only His hand.


Sin is defined


