## We Are Aware

### Key Points:

God is working all together for the good, but most people are not aware of this fact.....8395

**I**n believing the evangel, the believer becomes aware of God in a way that is hidden from those who do not believe. ... Paul writes (Romans 8:28),

*Now we are aware that God is working all together for the good ...*

The next words might well be rendered as follows:

*[This awareness is] for those who are loving God, who are called ...*

The Greek does not literally say “of” those who are loving God, but “to” or “for” those who are loving God. **God is working all together for the good, but most people are not aware of this fact.** Yet if we are believing the evangel, we are becoming aware of this sure and certain aspect of God’s character and pattern of His operations.

Romans 8:28 corresponds with telling harmony to what Paul writes in Romans 3:21-22. As believers being justified gratuitously in God’s grace, as those who are called, we are becoming aware of God’s righteousness. This righteousness is one that sees to it that all is for good. This is the character of God’s active and all-inclusive involvement in all that occurs. He is working all together for good.

As believers we are aware of this because this is what God tells us in the evangel we are believing. We are

told that God has a purpose, and that we are called into a special calling in accord with that purpose – and this purpose involves all that happens and all that exists. It is, as Paul will later write, God’s purpose in Christ,

*to have an administration of the complement of the eras, to head up all in the Christ – both that in the Heavens and that on the Earth (Ephesians 1:9-10).*

This purpose is the purpose of God,

*Who is operating all in accord with the counsel of His will (Ephesians 1:11).*

From the very beginning of revelation, this principle has been laid down: that what God does is all for good (Genesis 1:31). Now that Christ has died for our sins and has been roused, the goodness of God’s operations and purpose has become apparent.

The evangel itself, concerning Christ’s death for sinners, is not presented immediately in a direct way

God loves us and is absolutely sovereign, and because of that, all will turn out perfectly fitted to His glory and to our benefit. ....8398

Until one knows God intimately, they cannot really know the love of God. How can a child know the love of a parent until that child grows to know them?

In the case of a newborn child, that bond of "knowing" the mother is formed almost immediately after birth. That would appear self-evident, since that child had been carried in the womb for nine months. As for the father, that bonding or getting to know his child may take a little longer, but in most cases is established fairly quickly.



The reverse is also true. While parents may not know a lot of things about their infant right away, such as its temperament or fears, they do know that the child came from them, and as time goes on, they, too, come to grow to know the child. The parents spend a lifetime knowing things about that child.

Yet, unfortunately, sometimes a child grows up and, in their parents' view, becomes a disappointment. Their love for that child may even be quite strained, sometimes to the breaking point. While the parents' ability to change this situation is severely

In what may be the most comprehensive verse in the Bible, Paul writes in Romans 11:36 that “all is out of God, all is through Him and all is to Him.” Take time to meditate on this verse. To realize that the great God of the Universe just didn’t know *about* us, but actually *KNEW* us before we were even born, is overwhelming to say the least. How could He not know us, and hence love us, since it is He Who made us? Since we came forth from Him, every fiber of our being was crafted by God Himself. Thus, He knows us far better than we even know ourselves, and yet He still loves us with unmatched passion.

*Known to God are all His works from the beginning of the ages [aiōnos] (Acts 15:18, BSV).*

God made us and we are the work of His hands, thus, Job 23:13-14 says,

*What His [God’s] soul has yearned for He shall do. For He shall accomplish what is marked out for me (CV).*

Our God made each of us exactly the way He wanted us to be, even with our present faults and failures. His love is strong and sure, and even if most of the time it may not look like that, rest assured that His love, and His Son’s love, *transcend human knowledge*.

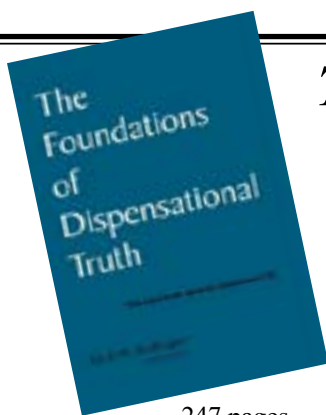

**I**t will be useful to all if we define some of the terms that are being used in these lessons. Common ground is paramount for effective communication. We will start by considering three terms, and as these lessons progress, we will define other terms as needed.

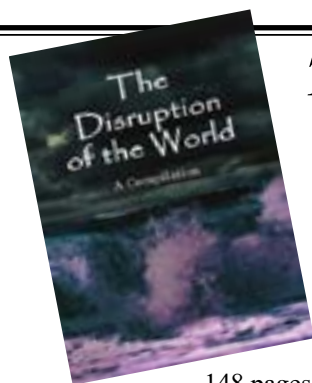
### FREE WILL

The first term to discuss will be "free will." Free will is simply the ability to make a decision without being influenced by any external or internal influences. God is the only one in the Universe who has free will. He is not influenced by anyone or anything. We, on the other hand, have no free will since we are always influenced by something when we make decisions. We

do have a will, but it is not free. We are quite capable of making decisions, but they are always influenced by other factors. In the final analysis, all influencing occurs internally because "*all is out of God*" (Romans 11:36) and God is the One Who influences all decisions we make by bringing things into our lives which will cause us to "make" the decisions that we make.

### EVIL

The next term to discuss is "evil." Evil is the term to use to describe that which is distressed, disjointed, destroyed, in disarray, or any other terms describing these types of conditions.

## *The Disruption of the World*

### *A Compilation*

**All sin is evil, but not all evil is sin.** If a company is hired to bring down and destroy a building in order to make way for a new one, they are performing “evil” on that building because they are destroying it, and during this process they are distressing the steel and other load bearing materials that were used to keep the building standing. This would not be considered sinful though. Not all evil has a moral component to it. When Nazi Germany persecuted the Jewish people by trying to eradicate them during the 1920’s through the mid 1940’s they were engaging in and were performing evil, and it certainly was a great sin.

## SIN

“Sin” is a term people like to throw around a lot. They try to define it by telling us what they consider it to be, not what the definition actually is. The definition of “sin” is *to miss the mark*. Simple as that.

*Everyone could sling stones at an hair breadth, and not miss (Judges 20:16).*

The Hebrew word translated “miss” here is **חָטָא** (*châtâ*),<sup>1</sup> a word repeatedly translated “sin.” This verse demonstrates that there were men who handled the sling shot and were so good that they did not miss their target. They did not “sin” because they did not “miss.”

If a person goes onto the basketball court and begins to shoot free throws, let’s say that the best that this person can do is seven out of ten free throws. This means that they missed three free throws out of

ten attempts. In other words, they sinned three times because they missed the target, or in this case, the basket.

Now, there is no moral component to shooting free throws, but the fact that a person missed three times brings some level of disappointment because of it, and if it happened during the NCAA basketball championship game, there would be real pain, especially for those fans of the team that the “misser” was playing for. This is where the “evil” part comes in, because missing those free throws would cause distress and consternation in many quarters.

Trying to hit the mark and coming up short is sin. **We do not have a sinful nature; we just lack the vitality to carry out actions. So sometimes we “miss.”**

*Therefore, since by one man sin<sup>2</sup> entered the world, resulting in death, then death passed into all men, so that all men sin (Romans 5:12, BSV).*

Thus, Paul affirms in Romans 3:23 that “*all have sinned and come short of the glory of God.*”

These definitions will help in gaining a better understanding in future lessons, and will erase some of the misconceptions that people may have concerning these terms and words. **BSN**

## Today's Ecclesia: An Out-Calling to Christ Alone

[To J.G.:] I spent about a decade in the “camp” that Frank Viola now champions. We distributed Robert Banks’ book, *Paul’s Idea of Community*, and cited him in the *Bible Student’s Notebook* (#21, page 208; #28, page 283).

The problem with Viola’s view is that it discounts the actual makeup of the Greek word *ekklēsia* (prefix and root), rather siding with its usage by “early Christians.” These “early Christians” were those of the synagogues of whom Paul declared, even prior to his receiving of the revelation of the Secret Administration, “that all they who are in Asia have turned away from me” (II Timothy 1:15, *REB*). Therefore, the usage of *ekklēsia* by “early Christendom” is as meaningless as is its use by “modern Christendom.”

“The early Christians [that] gathered regularly in a given city” were those of Jewish Synagogues, and thus after Israel became Lo-ammi in Acts 28, they

were merely *apostate* gatherings without any basis or spiritual life.

Today, we are God’s Ecclesia, and our out-calling is not to some meeting, assembly or congress, but to Christ Himself. **HE alone** is our meeting place, and that “*far above all Heavens*” (Ephesians 4:10), where we have been seated “*together among the Celestials, IN Christ Jesus*” (Ephesians 2:6). The ignorance of the unique *ekklēsia* of the Secret Administration, “*the Ecclesia which is His Body*” (Ephesians 1:22-23), leaves one to wander in the wilderness of Christendom.

## Chapter and Verse Divisions

Our Bible’s chapter and verse divisions allow us to quickly locate and reference a particular portion of Scripture; but we must always keep in mind as we read and study the Bible that these divisions are in fact man-made.

Eugene H. Glassman (1924-2009) gives us some historical background.

The first English edition to use chapter numbers was Wycliffe's version of 1382. Verse divisions in the Greek New Testament were introduced by Robert Stephanus of Paris in 1551. The Latin Vulgate edition of 1555 was the first entire Bible to use chapter and verse numbers; the first English New Testament to contain them was the Geneva Bible of 1560 (*The Translation Debate*, 1981, page 37.)

## Only One Gospel Today

The righteousness of God is that God works all together for good. This working of all together for good is centered upon God's giving of His Son for sinners. It is built upon the faithfulness and obedience of Je-

sus Christ in dying for our sake. We who believe the evangel are aware that this is so. It is manifest to us.
